# Recap from Last Week

This week provided a small respite from chaos. The Senate held a 20 hour filibuster to compel changes to SJR 74 (Coleman) seeking to change the Initiative Petition Process. It ended up passing out of the Senate along party lines early Tuesday afternoon (2/20), but democrats succeeded in removing the ballot candy so we can communicate effectively with voters about the actual damage the bill would do instead of focusing on scare tactic the GOP wanted to employ to trick voters into a YES vote. This bill sailed through fiscal oversight and was sent to the House on Thurs, 2/22 where it was first read and will likely be referred to a committee on Monday for a hearing next week.

The Senate Select Committee on Empowering Parents and Children (EMPAC) held an executive session on Wednesday, 2/21 catching us and members of the committee a little off guard. Chairman Trent is new to us and does not necessarily publish which bills would be exec'd, relying on the standard language that any bill already heard in committee could be exec'd out at any hearing. The bills that moved one step closer to floor debate are: two voucher bills SB 1391 (Fitzwater) and SB 1392 (Trent) which also has charter expansion; open enrollment SB 1051 (Trent); assessment an accreditation SB 1366 (Trent). We continue to monitor them and will advise on what membership can do when the time comes.

The House General Laws Committee voted an anti-DEI bill out of committee on Tues 2/20. Four identical bills were combined into one using Rep. Cody Smith's HB 2619 as the primary vehicle. No other changes were made. It was voted out along party lines and is on the Regulatory Oversight Committee agenda for Monday 2/26 at 2:15 pm. See the CALL TO ACTION on how to contact the committee. Rep. Baker's HB 2567 anti-DEI bill specific to healthcare was not voted out which indicates it may have stalled.

The committee also voted out **HB 2634 (Smith)** which will defund Planned Parenthood. It is on the **Legislative Oversight Agenda for Monday 2/26 at 2:30** to be exec'd out. We have been following guidance from partner organizations on this bill. Contact for all committees is found with the same link and is in the call to action.

**HB 1518 (Hudson)** allowing discrimination of marginalized communities on college campuses was voted out of oversight on Monday 2/19; it can be brought up for debate this week. See the CALL TO ACTION
